Dear Mr. President,

We write to reiterate our strong view that the failure to brief *all* Members of the House Intelligence Committee into the operational details of the NSA surveillance program constitutes an ongoing violation of the National Security Act of 1947, as amended. *See* 50 U.S.C. § 413(a)(a).

Last week, the Ranking Member personally asked the Vice President to allow all 20 members of the Committee to be briefed, as opposed to the group of 11 that you have proposed. The Vice President declined the request, presumably on the grounds that briefing the full Committee would constitute a security risk.


Several hundred individuals in the Executive Branch have been briefed, but you continue to insist that nine Members of HPSCI – Democrats and Republicans – cannot be trusted with the information. This is an insult. As Members of the Select Committee, we handle highly classified information nearly every day. Failure to brief the full Committee compromises the oversight we are charged with conducting on behalf of the American people.


